We are very excited to work with our students and families once again, with the start to the 2022-2023 school year! The school day will begin at 8:30am on Monday, August 15th. The 22-23 Bell Schedule and Odd/Even Calendar are included in this packet. The campus will be open every morning around 7:15am and breakfast will be available for students every day before school from 7:30am - 8:20am.

Incoming 9th grade students are invited to Freshmen Orientation with our LINK Crew on Friday, August 5th from 8:30am to 12:30pm. Parents of incoming 9th grade students are also invited to attend parent informational meetings at the same time as Orientation.

Late registration will be available for any other families you might know who are not yet enrolled. Our office will be open for late registration from 4:00pm to 7:00pm on Tuesday, August 2nd and Tuesday, August 9th.

Save the date for Back to School Night on Monday, August 29, 2022 from 6:00pm to 8:00pm, where you will have the opportunity to meet our staff and receive information about your child's classes at Roosevelt High School. Prior to Back to School Night, we will also hold our Title I Parent Informational meeting at 5:00pm in the cafeteria.

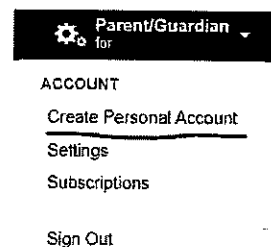

We will do our best to keep you informed of all school information, events, and issues. Information will be communicated through a new tool, ParentSquare. It is important that your contact information is accurate in our ATLAS system. If you have changes to your contact information, you can call our main office at 559-253-5200, or you can update the information through the ATLAS Parent Portal by creating and using a Personal Account.

The ATLAS Personal Account allows parents to update contact information, manage emergency card information for your children, and access all of your children's information and grades with one single log-in.

Once you have created your Personal Account, please ensure your personal contact information is current and complete the online emergency card for your child in this portal.

As a parent/guardian, it will be important for you to check-in with your child, and consistently monitor their attendance and grades in ATLAS. Ensure that your child is planning their time to complete assignments, which they can do with the RHS student planner they will receive to help them stay organized.

School Protocol Updates

- While we support students using skateboards for transportation, they cannot be carried around campus and must be locked in our skateboard locker during the school day.
- We will not accept food deliveries from UberEats, DoorDash, etc. Deliveries will be turned away at the main office. Off-site lunch is a privilege earned only by Seniors and Juniors who meet the appropriate requirements.

As we continue to focus on providing a healthy environment for students and staff, we ask that students continue to utilize the self-health screening tool every day, prior to coming to school.

At Roosevelt, our teachers and staff work hard to ensure that Roosevelt High School provides a positive learning experience for all students. We understand the importance of a strong connection between school and home, and we look forward to having the opportunity to work with you this coming school year.

## Schedule Distribution & ID Picture Days

Class schedules will not be available in ATLAS until the first day of school. Students can get a print-out of their schedule, and have an opportunity to correct any schedule issues with their counselor, by attending their schedule distribution and picture day.

### Documents Required for Schedule Distribution & ID Picture Day:

*Students must bring the following with them when coming to their schedule distribution and picture day:*

1. **Emergency Cards (2)**, completed by parent/guardian (bring blank if completed digitally in ATLAS)
2. **Notification Regarding Expulsion form** signed by parent/guardian and student
3. **Annual Parent Student Notification and Consent form** signed by parent/guardian

### Important Notes for ID Pictures

The following are clothing/dress items that is inappropriate for school ID pictures:

Shirts/Blouses: No majority red; no display of inappropriate content; shirts must not show midriff/belly and cannot be transparent or clear; shirts cannot be low cut or explicitly suggestive.

Headgear: No bandanas of any color; no hats will be allowed in ID pictures.

Accessories: No sunglasses, or any other accessory that covers or partially covers the face (masks will need to be removed for your student ID and yearbook picture).

Note: For 9th-11th graders, your ID picture will also be your yearbook picture.

### ID Cards

For the 2022-23 school year, we will be shifting to Digital ID cards for students through the Minga app. When students take their ID pictures, they will be given instructions for setting up their Digital ID. Students who need a physical ID can still get one by requesting it through their counselor.

*A 2022-23 Digital ID must be presented upon request while on campus, and is required for school events.*

### Course Request Changes (require counselor and/or admin approval):

- Acceptable: Updraft course (Gate, Honors, AP), AP course changes (3+ AP), change or join a pathway
- Unacceptable: Electives, 4th year of math/science (requires additional documentation)

## California Assessment System, 2023

**TO PARENTS/GUARDIANS:** California’s academic standards—the things we want students to know and be able to do—are designed so students graduate ready for college and career. Students across California in grades 3-8 and high school take the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) assessments each spring. The online tests were created specifically to gauge each student’s performance in English language arts/literacy (ELA), mathematics, and science. These tests measure the skills called for by the academic standards, including the ability to write clearly, think critically, and solve problems.

The English Language Proficiency Assessments for California (ELPAC) measure how well English learner students are progressing with English language development in each of four domains: Listening, Speaking, Reading, and Writing.

**IMPORTANT:** Parents/Guardians have the right to exempt their child from CAASPP assessments pursuant to CA *EdCode* Section 60615. You may annually submit a written request to the principal of your child’s school to excuse your child from any or all parts of state assessments.

**NOTIFICATION REGARDING EXPULSION**

The Fresno Unified School District Board of Education has established policies and standards of behavior which promote learning and protect the safety and well-being of students. When these policies are violated, it may be necessary to suspend or expel a student. Board Policy 5144.1 aligns with California Education Code in its approach to serious offenses.

The following offenses will warrant a mandatory referral for expulsion:

1. Possessing loaded or unloaded firearms
2. Brandishing a knife at another person
3. Unlawfully selling a controlled substance
4. Sexual assault (including attempt) or sexual battery
5. Possessing an explosive

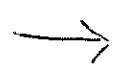
The offenses listed above will not be tolerated in school buildings, school grounds, and buses, going to or coming from lunch or school or at any school-sponsored activity.

For all other violations, the principal shall have the discretion to recommend expulsion of a student. If expulsion is recommended, the Board shall order the student expelled only if it makes a finding of either or both of the following:

1. That other means of correction are not feasible or have repeatedly failed to bring about proper conduct;
2. That due to the nature of the violation, the presence of the student causes a continuing danger to the physical safety of the student or others

Students who violate applicable Penal Codes, referenced by Board policy, will be referred to the appropriate law enforcement authorities.

This Board policy is publicized and each student and parent/guardian will be asked to sign a copy of the Notification Regarding Expulsion. If the letter is not returned to the school, the policy still applies to all students.

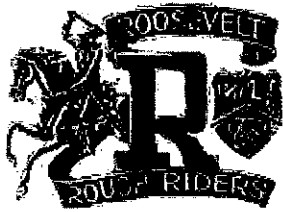
